Missing Metropolitan Areas

For crime figures to be reported for a metropolitan area, twelve months of complete data must be submitted for 75 percent of agencies and for the principal city or cities within that area. A number of metropolitan areas are not included in the comparative analysis because of missing data for specific offenses. As noted, forcible rape statistics were not available for metropolitan areas in Illinois and Minnesota. Aggravated assault data were not reported for the Auburn, AL; Decatur, AL; Dothan, AL; El Centro, CA; Ithaca, NY; Oklahoma City, OK; Shreveport-Bossier, LA; and Wilmington, NC, metro areas. Burglary statistics were not available for Charleston–North Charleston, SC; Kansas City, MO-KS; and New Orleans, LA, metro areas. Another group of metropolitan areas was not included in the comparative analysis because the FBI did not report data for these areas in its 2009 *Crime in the United States* report. These metropolitan areas are: Canton-Massillon, OH; Greenville, NC; Greenville-Mauldin-Easley, SC; Hanford-Corcoran, CA; Huntington-Ashland, WV-KY-OH; Johnstown, PA; Joplin, MO; Monroe, LA; Myrtle Beach–North Myrtle Beach–Conway, SC; Parkersburg-Marietta-Vienna, WV-OH; Terre Haute, IN; Virginia Beach–Norfolk–Newport News, VANC; Weirton-Steubenville, WV-OH; and Yakima, WA.
